 - a. Confirmations
 - i. Haroon Rashid Judicial Seat 13
 - 1. Speech: I am a biomed major, I am in my third year, I am a pre-med student but I am looking to get into more government work. I have been involved on campus for three years. I was president of the Pakistani club. I have been involved in med and political clubs. I have worked with SGA in the past more so in the inclusivity project. I have always wanted to be more involved with Sga and have been wondering how I can do more for the students.
 - 2. Questioning
 - a. St Preux: What is one initiative you intend on bringing to your role as justice that is going to result in the betterment of the judicial branch?
 - i. The number one thing for me is going to be the lack of understanding amongst the students at UCF when it comes to what the judicial branch does. It is important for students to understand how representatives can serve them. I wanted to work with the SGA inclusivity project, working with PLC that is very much involved in connecting different parts of campus together, working better with senators and creating more partnerships within SGA to create more opportunities for everyone to access.
 - b. Rutledge: How much time are you willing to delegate to Judicial?

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- i. I have a pretty free semester but I am willing to devote however much time is needed., In the past I have held different positions but I have scaled back to focus on just a few things.
- c. Moscol: What experience has helped you the most for this position?
 - i. A little bit of everything. I am aware that a lot more people have more SGA experience than I do. I think where my qualifications come in is from being involved in different areas of campus. I served as a peer mentor to help students that were on academic probation. We did a lot of work with the office of student conduct. I have also worked on increasing awareness of students rights on all sorts of matters. I worked at the State Department last summer, we tried to cater to everyone individually. I learned a lot there and I would love to bring what I learned there over.
- d. Rutledge: What are your statutory requirements as a justice?
 - i. I will be totally honest, I have gone over that stuff a lot of time but I am still not quite well-versed. I understand that justices do a lot of work on campus with being assigned to different committees. They are picked to be on these committees.
- e. Moscol: How would you implement the Hippocratic oath into your work as a justice?
 - i. I am trying to remember exactly what that goes like... That is something that I have never really thought of too much because it feels like a common sense type of issue. I think in implementing that comes respect, personal understanding of one's own values. When it comes to dealing with certain issues, everyone has their own biases. People that are able to identify those biases and recusing themselves from them when they come up are some of the ways I would go about that.
- f. Appline: How long is does your term last?
 - i. Each term is appointed for two years. I feel like there was an alternating system.
