- 5. Open Forum -
 - Tom Hope Tomorrow is a BOT Retreat, Student Body President LaRosa will be in attendance. At this meeting plans will be discussed before getting approval from the government. CAL State made plans to go online, we are hoping to meet somewhere in the middle. Overall, our number one priority is to keep students, so we are trying to be flexible while also providing the same high-quality education for students.
 - Questions and Answers
 - Q: Vice Chair Slaughter: Our biggest initiative is our COVID-19 survey. We believe that outreach to the student body at large will yield more information on how we can best help the student body.
 - A: Tom Hope I have heard about the faculty supporting and if I could offer advice it would be to have other administrators looking over it to make sure you are asking questions in the right frame to get the information we need.
 - Q: Senator O'Blenis 2 questions
 - Q: Has leadership and the president's office considered if there's no vaccine and the spike increase, how will the university go about phasing things out?
 - A: UCF was fortunate to be able to switch to online mode within the first week the cases began to sharply increase. Throughout this time, we have been able to learn what is working and what isn't working. Certain classes that need to be face to face like music and clinical we want to have in person, while classes like calculus could be online. So, when we see what works we are definitely thinking

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about how things would work under any circumstances. We also want to hear some of your ideas on lessons learned.

- Q: Due to us having the second largest student body presence do you see State
 Legislators adding more funding for online staff to curve the sudden shift from
 in person workers to a new need for more online staff.
- A: I can see the biggest impact being Financial Aid, the workers there have been overwhelmed. I do think by then we will have more experience and the current staff will be more successful every day. Every school in the country is going to go through budget cuts due to the economy at large. Our biggest source of revenue is from the state, so we are planning for any scenario. To answer it, at its crux I do not think we will be hiring additional staff, we have frozen a lot of the budget so I don't think we will.
- Chair Desai Has UCF considered Dual-course mode where it's optional for the students.
- I have heard from the administration side and how we will work with the faculty, say there's 30 people and 15 show Monday and people switch coming in is there a way we can maintain socially distant. We are mainly trying to protect those vulnerable to the disease and how can we make accommodations for those students. So yes, I believe that option is being looked into.

Regan: What has been done to talk to people that can affect change about this issue?

Desai: I reached out to several people and definitely tried to work some stuff out before moving on with this resolution but with the way things were going, it did not seem effective enough.

Regan: My goal for being here today is to collaborate with SBA and the division of Student Affairs. There are several other things that could be done prior to writing the resolution such as reaching out to Jim, Sara Hunt, and higher administration to plant the seeds we already have. Would you like help reaching out to these individuals before going forward with this resolution?

Desai: Before I send this off, we can try and get this on second reading tomorrow. But before I do send it off, I will wait until it is the appropriate time for me to send it.

Graham: I do believe this is a way for us to start collaborating with the safety and transportation coordinator but unfortunately, she won't be confirmed until tomorrow. What kind of lighting are you guys looking for?

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Desai: Our goal is for us to see what is going on and where we are going across the entire field. We are not looking for a specific kind of lighting nor have we really looked into it. But it would cost about \$800 a month to get the whole field lighted properly.

O'Blenis: Be mindful that anyone can ask to see this resolution under sunshine laws

O'Blenis: move to postpone resolution 52-32

Desai: I object

O'Blenis: Before we pass this resolution, we would need to have a further conversation and collaborate with more people. This resolution is not really the most effective way to communicate the intended message

Desai: I understand that, but I believe the purpose of a resolution is to express something and not necessarily to force people to do something about it. I believe we should vote on this resolution so we can shed light on this issue.

Regan: As a member of the golden rule committee, I would like to provide some insight to this resolution. Any policies upheld by the university is enforceable. Right now, students can be sent to student conduct for smoking on campus. Reaching out to SDES can be beneficial. Talking to the sustainability coordinator can also be useful in reminding students that this behavior is not encouraged on campus.

Desai: I wrote this resolution because students would often ask me about it. I definitely want to talk to SDES about promoting the smoke free campus campaign next year.

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Regan: SDES can start the campaign again and Student Government can recognize this policy which would mean a lot.

Desai: move to go back to formal; approved by GC
