 - a. Fiscal Policy Workshop

 - 1. Chair: Similar to the one presented at Orientation
 - 2. Chair
 - a. CRT Page:
 - i. Conference Registration and Travel account has 540,000 (60k left). Not sure if we are opening the form for the time being. Title 8, Appendix A has the CRT Spending Policy (ie continually enrolled). Group Rosters must have two financially trained officers and have the proper student IDs. At least one who has training must go. There is the possibility of student groups being prorated if they do not have the full roster go. Workday increased the timeline for requests (ie UCF Global). ORS precedents have been lenient on students who have been affected by delays due to these timelines. Allocations must be read into minutes for the process to start. Bills take a while to process (several signatures and relay procedures). We are prohibited from spending funds on certain items pursuant to state, university policies unless approved by the Provost. The spending caps have been changed. Allocations and bills adhere to caps that limit the total amount students can request. Do attend CRT meetings!
 - b. FAO:
 - i. Senate working fund at 260,000 in the next year. Relatively less busy and fewer mistakes

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from FAO due to lack of volume compared to CRT. Must be an RSO to go through FAO. Speakers, promo items and other items with justification from the RSO (ie the items must adhere to the RSO's mission statement). They have the SG logo and a tagline that are statutorily required to be added onto the logos. Four business weeks for allocations, twelve for bills (same as CRT). Similar limitations to FAO policy in what can be spent (ie non-accessory clothing articles (shirts)). If something is bought that breaks Appendix B and is missed by the ASFBO it's our discretion as to what is the sanction.

c. ORS:

i. Operations Review and Sanctions. Reviews both Senate accounts. Power to sanction if Title VIII is violated. Ensure funds are used properly (by way of VPFs which track and catalogue receipts). Cases are unique, some can be from the result of out of control circumstances (ie Workday or conference cancellations). Probation is invoked due to reversions over a specific amount (20%), failure to contribute at least 95% of their Half. Probation is a hold, and they are called in order to have that hold lifted, possibly with a sanction. We conduct post-funding reviews in addressing that probation. Do have the title up when adjudicating cases and there are recommendations posted in the agenda by the Chair that are found in Appendix C. The numbers in statutes (Title VIII, C) are recommendations, it is our discretion to decide the sanction amount. Sanctions stack (ie sanctioning people twice at 10% will be be a

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sanction of 20%). Sanctions last a calendar year and will limit funding requests that affect SG Funding allocations (ie allocations of 100\$ will realize 80\$ if the requestor is under a 20% sanction). Forms. Five days after the reversion date, VPFs will be seen and either be accepted or be used to call people in. Post Funding Forms ask students how the funding process was and what to do.

 - 1. June 30, July 1

 - From the day they were placed on probation, the day they were seen for sanctions.

 - If they use at least 80% of their funds, then they're fine (even if 81%) due to fluctuations. Prorating changes the reversion amount.
- iv. DLeg: Caps:
 - There is a funding cap for an unlimited number of events for allocations.
 Spending caps for fiscal bills also exist.

 - 1. Chair: Post Funding Process is after the student receives funds. They submit forms and meet with the business office. 80% reversion rate for bills AND allocations; 95% contributions only for bills. PFP is the hearing in committee asking what happened and whether to sanction. VPFs are required, Post Funding Forms are not but do help in making our process better. We do advise with CRT and FAO to make

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funding processes more efficient. Akin to an auditing department. Sanctions limits the amount of funds students receive (ie 10% sanction on a 100\$ = 90\$). Reversion dates are **30 days** after the final day of travel (for CRT allocations, bills) or after the event (FAO allocations, bills). VPFs are a collection of receipts that proves that the RSO had purchased their share of items that equaled at least 95% of their contribution.

- 2. Title VIII: Finance Code. Authorizes our existence and the spending policies of CRT, FAO and sanction policy of ORS (Appendices A, B and C, respectively).

 - i. 90% for an RSO due to several different issues...they're unable to really request anything. We tried contacting them but they simply did not respond
