12. Member Discussion-

Temple – after this year it's very important to work for women

Hurst – it's important to work with SBA and GAP to combat what's happening on the state level

Temple – it's not that were opposing what the state is doing but informing the student body of what the state is doing, leaving bread crumbs, giving them means to advocate, because there are a lot of women who have a lot to say about what has been going on. Allowing the caucus to present the information and holding an advocacy fair that works along other caucuses to highlight advocacy amongst women as a whole and current events affecting women as a whole

Bishop – i agree. In contact with American women medical association about hosting a medical fair during women's history month

Temple – joined and is a fellow for men's for choice (a pro-reproductive organization targeting men not involved with the movement) and wants to share info about the fair to the organization, to share the men's and gender fluid voice

Hurst – great idea to give a voice to advocacy and to bring more than one perspective. Wants to help

Sandlin – there's a petition to get abortion on the ballot in 2024, so we should get in contact with them to host an event to get signatures.

Lacassee- plugging the link

Holmes – invite legislatures to reproductive fair – reach out to Carlos and Anna Eskamani. Have ASAP because there is probably a deadline for the ballot. Temple and Holmes can reach out.

Damarla – I don't know if we can out right petition, be careful pointing people in a direction. Line could be blurry.

Holmes – good thing to point out, as SG we probably can't, but the legislatures cant, so we have to tell them they can do it individually but we cant. Invite people that go beyond like those at Health Center. Reproductive rights go beyond abortion – STD. Temple – as SG we could bring information and allow 3rd party representatives (Frost and Sotto) to push

Damarla – a little warry about having political figures from only one side, because it could look like that SG is only having people from one side, so invite women from the other side or women advocates. We want to be as informative as possible

Hurst – agrees we should invite everyone, but it is likely that those who don't support reproductive freedoms may not show, to cover all of our bases

Temple – very tricky to get legislatures as it is, so usually pushed to GAC but

Holmes does have contacts. Good idea to invite women advocates as a whole to show we want all perspectives, but will be difficult, and maybe impossible. Could we rebrand this?

Bishop – we didn't really focus on political involvement, we were more focused on health, because as Holmes said reproductive rights aren't just abortion. Not sure if we want to focus on politics or health. Agrees that we would have to extend the invite.

Holmes – narrow down what you want from this reproductive fair. Syphilis epidemic right now. Is it about abortion, or check ups? So you know who to invite. Our rep is Republican, so we could reach out (wont respond) but we should focus on health care (abortion is health care)

Bishop – abortion is healthcare which is why we wanted to focus on reproductive healthcare so we can focus on abortion access and medical, but will speak to her about whether we will shift to a more political

Temple – is there a middle ground? Because it is hard to segment the policy side out, so lets do both, bringing in AMSA and the medical professionals and those who can explain legislation in states and what is being planned and what it means, getting students in the know to what's going on

Bishop – loves the solution – middle ground, could work very well Hurst – agrees, but up to RSO wants them to be happy doesn't want them to think were steamrolling
