- 2. Speech
 - a. Thanks for reaching out about this! I am happy to provide some clarity and answer these questions. We are no longer the officers of this RSO but, since I completed this form on behalf of SPIOP, I can be your point of contact for this process.
 - b. As for your first two questions regarding the hotel costs and selection of hotels, this relates to the funding process. As you know, it is a lengthy process to propose and pass a Senate Bill and then have everything processed on UCF's side to begin purchasing. The Annual Society for Industrial and Organizational Psychology (SIOP) Conference has partner hotels, but these sell out extremely fast. [Chair: We had asked about hotel costs] Over 4,500 people attend the conference and, therefore, hotels in the host city tend to sell out fast and fluctuate in price. Once funding is approved and we were able to book hotels, our members had to book hotels wherever they were able to find open rooms that aligned with their personal budgets. Thus, some members (e.g., Emily Hill) were able to spend more on their lodging than others. I hope that helps clear up the variations in hotels and associated costs.
 - c. As for the Chat Hospitality receipt, that is not an AirBnb but an Inn that is located in Boston. Please see website here https://www.longwood-inn.com
 - d. Regarding additional contributions, we do have many other expenses related to the conference beyond lodging. For example, baggage fees, transportation to and from the conference and airport (e.g., rideshare services, public transit,

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rental cars), meals throughout the conference, and SIOP membership to name a few. Considering all of these expenses, I am confident that we spent at least the \$29,185.30 you mention. However, as three months have passed and many of our members who attended the conference have since graduated, I'm not sure whether we would be able to provide receipts for all of these expenses.

- Chair: We only allow for primary travel expenses (ie planes)
- e. Next, 41 SPIOP members attended the conference. Unfortunately, 6 individuals listed on the bill were unable to attend and therefore did not spend any of the funds. [Chair: This RSO, then, was prorated based on % of those who could not go. Not good for them] As for whether we were aware that we needed to spend \$29,185.30, this was something I brought up very early in our funding process with the business office. After the funding had been approved by SGA (sic), some of the students on the bill let me know that they were no longer able to attend. I mentioned this to the business office and asked whether we should reach out to SGA (sic) to ask for our funding total to be lowered to account for the students who were no longer attending. The business office staff told me not to worry and that the additional funds from those students could be used for other students - as long as we spent all of the money allotted by SGA (sic), it was fine. I trusted them as I figured they are the experts on this process and I am distraught over the fact that we have been misled.
- f. When we started booking flights and conference registration, I again brought up my concerns that we might end up under what was initially budgeted for, if we did not include any additional expenses. Again, I asked whether we should reach out to SGA (sic) to inform them. I had anticipated letting students know to keep track of all their expenses and/or be sure to book a hotel that would be enough to meet our proposed contribution. However, the business office

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- reassured me that as long as all of the money on the bill was spent on the conference there was nothing else we needed to worry about. Again, I trusted the business office staff as they are full-time UCF employees and therefore presumably know the policies better than I do.
- g. If we were to remove the 6 students who did not end up attending from the bill, that would have removed \$7,924.92 from our Senate Bill, which would have mitigated this issue. I have no doubt that we would have been able to contribute our half through hotels alone had those 6 students been removed. I also would have ensured everyone knew the total amount of money that they had to personally spend and kept all of their receipts as proof if I had received that advice from the business office. That was never clarified to me and brushed off as no concern by the business office so, honestly, your email took me by surprise.
- h. I hope this helps clear up any questions and concerns. As you can imagine, keeping track of a group of our size through the lengthy funding process is no easy feat. Our RSO, SPIOP, has always been in good standing with SGA and is diligent in our processes to ensure everything is adequate on our end. I personally will ensure the new officers are extremely clear on the policies that were not clear to me. Please let me know what additional questions you have and what I can do to avoid the fiscal probation.
