 - i. <u>Proclamation 55-05</u> [Proclamation to Designate October 2023 as LGBTQ+ History Month] 5/5/5
 - 1. Speech (5): Hameed: In the coming weeks LGBTQ+ History Month is coming up and as a caucus we wanted to recognize this. Pride is celebrated in October from the 20th to the 22nd which ends with a daylong festival. UCF's Multicultural Student Center holds programming all month long as they have done so for years. The community has faced numerous challenges and victories since the 1800s in the US and many of these challenges have gained notoriety. With these changes and victories, we should celebrate this time for the community. UCF is one of the largest campuses in the nation and we host a variety of different communities. A lot of these communities are interconnected whether it is within Greek life or minority based RSOs. Following this we will have an event on October 19th from 4 to 6 pm to provide resources to students whether they are part of the community or want to learn more. Celebrating does not only mean within the community but also outside the community. When I ran for caucus chair, I was and am aware of the challenges the community still faces and something I wanted everyone to know was we still need to focus on the positive and celebrate it. Another thing is that the community is intersectional meaning we all have different identities that overlap with one another. This is an important proclamation and it looked back, and the earliest passing was with the 53rd session. It could be earlier, but I do not

have access to those records. We should continue this tradition, support, and celebration for the community.

- 2. Question (5+ 2-minute extension):
 - Acosta: I heard that there is going to be conflict between LGBTQ+ history, and the promotion of this history. How will this be affected by the current and future Florida laws.
 - i. Yalamanchili: The law you are referring to is don't say gay, which prohibits teachings about sexual teachings, and has now been extended to high school as well. Since we are on a college environment, we won't really be affected.
