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- iii. Chair Temple: Sustainability Coordinator can talk about Environmental Policy.
- iv. Sustainability Coordinator Burge: SB 144. Collaborator brought up SB 144 State Renewable Energy Rules, widely accepted bill to back. Revising definitions, prohibiting drilling of oil, gas, or petroleum. Providing legislative intent. Creating advisory committee, etc. Wanted to also talk about delegation of new FL state bird. Mockingbird is native to SE US. Want bird native to FL. SB 162.
- v. Chair Temple: Look at <u>SB 144</u> for 2024. When it comes to digging into legislation, look at how it benefits student body as a whole.
- vi. Sustainability Coordinator Burge: A lot of FL universities work with petroleum based companies like Exon mobile. This prohibits drilling of oil in certain designated areas in FL. Big for students of environmental science majors and related majors. Renewable energy is beneficial to everyone. Would be great to move to campus. Marginal benefit starts to outweigh marginal cost. Creating the advisory committee is really cool. Cool to see more environmentally focused things happening in American policy.
- vii. GAC Martin: HB 193. Rep. Eskamani sponsored, basically same bill. Annual report must be submitted to legislature.
- viii. Vervuurt: As engineer, there's a push for renewable energy. Don't want future robbed by fossil fuel companies. In our best interest to push for this legislation. There's a lot of work to push for renewable energy whether it be solar energy.
- ix. Lacasse: Saw companion bill by Eskamani. There are people with connections to Rep. Eskamani. Maybe ELA Richmond can reach out to Rep. Eskamani.
- x. ELA Richmond: How would we do that nonpartisan?
- xi. Chair Temple: Frame it in a way that would benefit university as a whole. Having UCF match these would allow them to be a better university.
- xii. Vervuurt: When it comes to research, a lot of faculty push towards renewable energy. The more tech we produce, we're not getting advancements towards that. Faculty want people in STEM to push for legislation around environmental policies. Want to push people in STEM to go to DATC. Affects students as a whole and affects grants to university.

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- xiii. GAC Martin: Anyone can apply to DATC. Looking for students. Just emailed 13 colleges to ask if they have interest groups that would want to go. For example, if group of environmental students that want to go. If there's a group, we could potentially set something up. Certain areas mean areas by bodies of water. Just wanted to clarify.
- xiv. Chair Temple: How would this tangibly affect UCF as a whole? What can UCF do to make sure this bill passes? Effects?
- xv. Sustainability Coordinator Burge: We've been trying to get renewable energy for years at UCF. Student great energy fund was lost in the position from COVID. Works with reducing energy consumption. Starting competition with housing. Initial cost scares people away. Role covers sustainability and innovation: economic, social and environmental. A lot of the role is environmental. Carbon emission reduction HB 193 benefits everyone. Clearer air is better health. Affects everything.
- xvi. Vervuurt: Academically speaking, we're at apex of cytocollapse. No turning back. Trying to do risk reduction. We're done but trying to see how bad it will be for our lives. UCF as research institution produces insane things, but isn't communicated properly. UCF is empathetic with innovation. We have infrastructure for it, but because of not wanting to act, we're lacking in innovation. We have so many resources, faculty, and expertise. We need to speak to faculty members. I've spoken to many. Communication is key to fight misinformation and better future.
- xvii. Vasquez: SB 36 Comprehensive Waste Reduction. Thinks we should focus on pushing this bill.
- xviii. Chair Temple: Kostis has recycling initiative, so we can use his example. Plugging his initiative.
- xix. Sustainability Coordinator Burge: Why hasn't Kostis contacted me?
- xx. Wangen: It was from last year.
- xxi. Chair Temple: I'll have him reach out to you.
- xxii. Burge: Getting map made of where trash cans are lacking on campus. Wants to lobby for trash cans. 1 trash can is at the cheapest \$1000. Hard sell. Will have the map by Nov. 17.
- xxiii. Vervuurt: As Student Body, can we make our own trash cans rather than going through legislation?

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xxiv. Sustainability Coordinator Burge: No. We would need facilities approval.

xxv. JC: Why do they cost so much?

xxvi. Sustainability Coordinator Burge Outsourced trash can. Longevity. Would want animal proof trash cans but that's like \$3000.

xxvii. Chair Temple: We could take that up to legislature.

xxviii. GAC Martin: Doesn't understand why they're so expensive.

xxix. Vervuurt: If we had all the materials, could we do it?xxx. Burge: No. Would be about equal. Net equal cost.xxxi. Chair Temple: Would be best to do through legislature.

xxxii. Burge: Even loss of revenue to make all of them ourselves. We need about 70-200 more. College of Nursing has 1 trash can. So much litering on that campus. Everything is single use. If anywhere should have more trash cans, it would be College of Nursing. Research Pkwy has 2-3 trash cans.

xxxiii. ELA Richmond: College of Nursing is going to Lake Nona around Spring 2025. They lease the space.

xxxiv. Burge: Still needs trash cans.

xxxv. JC: If UCF leases it, if they don't renew lease, it's not UCF's property anymore?

xxxvi. ELA Richmond: They're just doing their thing. Parking lot issue with permits.

xxxvii. Chair Temple: 21 days without a Speaker.

xxxviii. Coordinator Burge: Will be here next week.

xxxix. Chair Temple: Won't keep committee for too long. Lots of substantial information today. Encourages committee to use today's information for the legislation. Reach out to RSOs or Interest Groups regarding policy to get expert info to use towards resolutions.
