- Credit equivalency and transfer issues (Beneche)
 - a. Updates:
 - i. Varela: Me and Elle had another meeting with Brian Boyd (the registrar) on Tuesday. It went well but because of the hurricane he did not have a lot of updates on the initiative. As a reminder the idea was to require faculty to give reasoning on why they denied a transfer credit for equivalency if the credit is denied. During this meeting we also talked about how the registrar's office can better communicate to transfer students during the equivalency evaluation process. He estimates that the changes we talked about can be rolled out starting in summer.

 - a. Updates:
 - i. Varela: Downtown Tabling next week. Dean meetings are coming soon.
 - ii. Caringal:
 - Downtown: The biggest issues are classroom layouts and charger/outlet accessibility. Shuttles are always wanted, especially at night. The food options are decent.
 - Rosen: Still the most common issue I hear is food options. Accessibility to food on campus is bad as machines are not always working and access across the street is unsafe through lanes of traffic. Having an on-campus option would be best. I have heard some issues with student areas not having outlets/good Wi-Fi too. Shuttles as well were a common complaint in terms of times.
 - Vasquez: Senator Widerberg is working on an initiative about outlets and charging stations for main campus somehow looping in satellite campuses.
