[Funding for 36 members of National Society of Black Engineers to travel to the NSBE Annual Convention in Chicago, Illinois from March 5<sup>th</sup>, 2025, to March 9<sup>th</sup>, 2025]

**WHEREAS**, National Society of Black Engineers (NSBE) has been a Registered Student Organization since 1975;  
**WHEREAS**, The mission of NSBE is to increase the number of culturally responsible black engineers to excel academically, succeed professionally and positively impact the community;  
**WHEREAS**, NSBE members pay dues of \$15 annually;  
**WHEREAS**, NSBE currently has 110 active dues-paying members;  
**WHEREAS**, The purpose of the NSBE Annual Convention is to provide your organization with the opportunity to source candidates on a local level and help fulfill your fall recruitment needs. Combining education, networking and job opportunities, FRCs offer the chance to recruit Black Engineers from your regional communities;  
**WHEREAS**, Each ANC includes a Career Fair, which enables organizations to recruit bright, diverse talent in engineering and other STEM fields. These unique, region-targeted events are the perfect place to match qualified candidates with your open jobs and internships on a national level, as well as at your regional and district offices. The Career Fair enables students to find local employment opportunities and is ideal for local employers looking to recruit top talent;  
**WHEREAS**, NSBE will be lodging at the Marriot Marquis Chicago McCormick Place in Chicago, Illinois, and  
**WHEREAS**, National Society of Black Engineers received \$721.90 via FAO Allocation 56-19 and \$7,600 via CRT Bill 56-13 in Activity and Service Fee Funds in the 2024-2025 Fiscal Year.

**THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED**, by the Fifty-Sixth Student Body Senate of the University of Central Florida that \$10,079.36 be allocated to National Society of Black Engineers from the Registration and Travel Account according to the following breakdown:

**BE IT FURTHER ENACTED**, That the National Society of Black Engineers completes a Verification of RSO Purchases Form by April 12<sup>th</sup>, 2025, as a condition of receiving funding.
