- k. Hurrell: So just to make sure, we have to finalize the dates right now, to save you from being sanctioned again,
 - i. Yes, please do 29-1
- I. McClellan: to inform you, because of sanction, your total would be \$5953.84
- m. Bhatheja: you mentioned five nights online, but with the new dates its still only four
 - i. Some students may be staying longer
- n. Bhatheja: So will you be coming on the third

- a. Hurrell: I am a little nervous that the floor will be nervous will individual rooms
- b. Wangen: See amendments and McClellan amendments as a block minus the dates
 - i. Speech
 - Hey, I looked at the exact cost of the hotel 29-2 a room with 2 queen beds, it totals \$1756. Cost per night, lowers it by around \$2000. I feel uncomfortable giving all separate rooms
 - ii. Questioning
 - 1. McClellan: Does this double them a. Yes
 - 2. Borges: do you think that everyone wants their own rooms or is it okay rooming as doubles
 - a. They would prefer individual rooms, but a few of them are open to rooming together
 - 3. Borges: How much is left in CRT account balance
 - a. \$327,713.66
 - iii. Debate
 - 1. McClellan: I can see both sides of this, there are some individuals that would like to be alone, the concern with approving this is that

- 2. Borges: I am against changing this, but we have so much money left over so we should approve them
- Wangen: Quick note that I put in Canadian dollars so it's actually a lot cheaper. Even though we have enough funds doesn't mean we should.
- 4. McClellan: If we were to change it to double it, would you be able to assign people to doubling it up and could you persuade
 - a. Some of the accommodations were for religious reasons, but we could talk to those who were not
- 5. Hurrell: Do you know the number of individuals with restrictions
 - a. I would have to speak with the president
- 6. Wangen: I will state that I made it 5 rooms instead of 8
- 7. Bhatheja: What do you mean by 5 and 3
 - a. If there are 5 men and 3 women it means that there would not be a gender mix

- 8. Borges: Would one singular extra room be enough for the rso
 - a. I would prefer an extra individual room
- Borges: Can we make it 6 rooms due to religious and gender restrictions

 If there is a real reason
- 10. McClellan: You did mention that the rooms are cheaper
 - a. Yes I am fixing it now
- 11. Hurrell: Clarify, there would be two individuals in there own room, and six rooms would give four individuals with their own room
- 12. McClellan: That is assuming the 3 5 split, but there would be more than one individual with their own room
- 13. Hurrell: I was just clarifying the split, there would be 2 rooms with 1 individual
- 14. McClellan: After that clarification, I do feel like that is accommodating, and for the religious reason we have enough accommodation
 - a. I agree, I believe we can convince our RSO
- 15. Borges: move to amend rooms from 5 to 6
 - a. Hurrell: If I am not mistaken the RSO was okay with keeping five

- b. Hurrell: Borges asked about six and McClellan asked about five
- c. RSO: Was it five or six, I think we would prefer six if we could
- d. Bhatheja: 5 bedrooms would have 2 individual rooms, then 6 bedrooms would have 4 with individual rooms
- 16. McClellan: Have you been in contact with Heather
 - a. She is at work
- 17. Hurrell: I wanted to let you know that we are talking about this, it might have issues passing on senate floors if we do six rooms instead of five
 - a. I think another thing we can talk about is if we don't get all the rooms we need, and we need more, would they come out of pocket, but we can try to accommodate what we have
- 18. McClellan: Is there any penalty for overspending
 - a. No they do not
- 19. McClellan: If we pass this and you want to spend the extra money to buy the sixth room then you may, we can only give \$5000 so the

whole debate doesn't really matter, as long as you meet the minimum requirement it doesn't matter

- a. When you say over, you mean over the \$13,000
- 20. Borges: To McClellan, because the increase of the room increases the funding, why do you think this matters
 - McClellan: I suppose that is valid, but I do feel like they can only use five rooms
- 21. Tribble: We are over the time
- 22. Hurrell: I wanted to say that if they already have 40% sanction then I would rather give them less and they pay more and not spend the amount they need we should
- 23. Wangen: Approval to fix the funding from Canadian to USD
- 24. Bhatheja: I think that a good middle ground would be six
- 25. Borges: Once the numbers are fixed, I think the RSO should get more money if they can, if we increase it then we should
- 26. Wangen: Can you do it on the amendment on your side

- 27. Borges: With the amount of money left on the account we should help the RSO as much as we can, people vote on fiscal bills without looking at the documents
- 28. McClellan: We did have people vote against this last week with excess spending
- 29. McClellan: If you want to change it to six, then you can and we can see this as an amendment, but right now we are voting for five rooms
- 30. Hurrell: Move to vote
