 - i. [Internal Bill 54-24](#) [Updates to Title IX: Adding Documents Censures may Reference][Senator Mole]
 - 1. Speech
 - a. McClellan: current language is vague, it adjusts 905.1 to add more detail. Can't include federal and state statutes per attorney general. I conveyed this to Senator Mole but received in response. The committee may accept any amendments that you wish, but I wanted to let you hear some context.
 - 2. Questioning
 - a. Parmar: Why can't we use federal and state statutes?
 - i. Mclellan: I will read the attorney general email, the student government can not use those laws as the

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- student government is not police and we can't enforce laws we don't fully understand those laws.
- b. Parmar: Since we can't use federal and state statutes, Are we allowed to introduce bills in order to introduce some federal or state law?
 - i. McClellan: I am not fully sure, if someone does try to use a loophole, individuals might ask the attorney general if this is okay. With the current attorney general she will probably stick to what she said about this bill
 - ii. Paramar: Follow up, how many student government bills are affected by federal law? Can we add bills that will adjust the laws?
 - iii. McClellan: UCF student government wouldn't have a bill stating you could do something the federal law says you can't since it is still the

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- iii. [Internal Bill 54-26](#) [Updates to Title XI: Adding a Nondiscrimination Clause to the General Code of Ethics][Senator Mole]
 - 1. Speech
 - a. Reads some whereas clauses, adds a new 1100.6 and reads out the new addition and adjusts the numbers following
 - 2. Questioning
 - a. Paramar: Wouldn't this be sort of a repetitive of the golden rule?
 - i. McClellan: Yes, but there is nothing hurting adding it.
 - b. Chair: Can I ask the Attorney general's opinion?
 - i. AG: if it is already in the golden rule, we are bounded by the golden rule
 - c. McClellan: POI: we are trying to add the golden rule to the list of documents for censure, if that is the case it could be redundant, in title 11 it has a similar wording.
 - d. Paramar: Reads golden rule, states "university" not students
 - e. McClellan: That is the student handbook, I think that is meant for the students
