  - a. Changing the Caucus' name from "Womxn's Caucus" to "Women's Caucus"
    - i. Yalamanchili: I don't know why they use the X, it is transphobic. It is dumb we should get rid of it.
    - ii. Hurrell: I would like to be a part of it.



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- iii. Foster: I can help, Guel wanted to do it last session.
- iv. Barekman: I have a trans sister, I feel like creating this inclusivity alienates people. Transwomen are women.
- v. Hurrell: directed to Barekman- When we say those who identify as women it can get complicated. Are you in favor of women with an E?
- vi. Barekman: Yes, but adding in people who identify as women, draws additional boxes around them. We should let people be people.

  - 3. Foster: Going around campus checking to see if any areas are dark and that seem unsafe to women
  - 4. Modha: I agree with Foster, we need to bring awareness to it. It is really hard walking around on campus. Personal experience, I tend to put my keys in between my knuckles. It happens more to women of color than white women. Write an initiative that put more blue lights, especially around Greek Park
  - Hurrell: I do agree that women of color are more unsafe than white women. I believe that the safety walk should have a diverse group of individuals on it.
