- Good evening everyone, this week ORS made it through a lot of business! We only have 6 post-funding reviews in old business for next week, which is the lowest it's been in a long while!
- We made decisions on all the post-funding reviews you heard earlier, and this week we had a short discussion about holidays and if there's any way for us to work around them better, which the answer is basically no, they have to be notified of their status on fiscal probation as soon as it happens and the 4 week countdown starts then. We also discussed how we will deal with RSOs that should have 2 sanctions applied in a short period of time and did make the decision that we will be more lenient with the second sanction, as not to overly punish an RSO for mistakes made in a short period of time.
- To address the sanction for FAO account 53-180, the committee has made their decision. The Judicial Fiscal Administrative Decision Appeal process exists for a reason, a route I always notify RSOs of when sending out the notice that they have been sanctioned. If an RSO disagrees with the decision made by the ORS committee, they may contact the Chief Justice to set up an appeal through the Judicial Branch.
 - I also want to thank Chair Holmes and Vice Chair Castelin for their help with trying to resolve this situation as cleanly as possible, they've been incredible!

 - Saucedo: I'm not sure what the best solution is. It's clear that many students are deeply impacted by this. We should look into what we can do as this body.
 - Brenner: As a student deeply impacted by the hurricane, it's been really difficult to find assistance and support from UCF.
 - Modha: Professors haven't been very lenient with students considering what's been going on. We need action from SG.
 - Taché: We should try to make a concrete list of demands from the university. If President Cartwright doesn't act on them, I have no problem writing a proclamation calling for his resignation.
 - Foster: The most important thing is to have information on how deeply students were impacted and what they need in a clear, concrete way.
 - Traynor: Wait until after Hall meets with Lopez to see what action is already being planned. Is YDSA involved with Knights Pantry or anyone else to coordinate a clothing/food drive?
 - Kostis: Some people in YDSA just spent \$300 on food and toiletry items to give out to students at next week's clothing drive to help provide hurricane relief
 - Spaulding: How do we make it so there's actually action taken by the university to help our students' voices are heard? How do we enforce this list?
 - Kostis: If we want Cartwright or admin to listen to us, we have to make them. We can't be passive and sit back while these things are going on. We need tangible methods of holding him accountable.
 - Castelin: We could have a commission to work together on all of these problems and write out the list mentioned. Is there a way to also include the student body? Perhaps a forum so we could all collaborate? Many RSOs are working on this, and we might want to join all of these powers together through collaboration.
 - Hurrell: This is something we need to get done. It was strange that we stayed open until Tuesday considering the severity of the weather. The action by the university before and following the hurricane have not been adequate.
 - Shelleh: Something that can be done for immediate action is that Senate could demand a hearing with faculty senate. We could potentially talk during open forum to get our thoughts to faculty. Collaboration could go a long way. We could create a document or dossier of information to compile and give to students with resources. We should set some form of deadline to hold ourselves and admin to this. As time passes, admin is less likely to give a favorable response.
 - Barekman: It's important to open ourselves up on an individual basis for one another.
 - Becerra: What if we created a document of all the resources for students and sent it out to apartment complexes and students. We could act as a bridge to resources for them. I would also like to collab with exec on this.
 - Taché: YDSA is now accepting hurricane supplies for their drive. I would love to have a meeting tomorrow to work on a list of demands.
 - Foster: We should set up a meeting, set up a list of demands, and send it out ASAP.
 - Parmar: We need this list of demands out ASAP. I would like to get as many senators to sign as possible.
 - Robbins: We will plan this in the GroupMe to meet either tomorrow or Monday.
- **Advisor's Report**
 - Brodie:
 - Doing drives is valuable but supporting other drives that have infrastructure is much more valuable. Advertising what is already happening on campus will be more useful than creating something new, as the framework already exists. The biggest thing that people need right now is money, if donations are possible. Knights Pantry is fully stocked and cannot accept many more donations.
