 - a. Hello everyone! Happy Wednesday to you all!
 - b. June 1st marks the first day of Pride Month!
 - Pride Month is meant to commemorate the 1969 Stonewall Riots. It has since also come to symbolize the impact of LGBTQ+ individuals in the United States of America.
 - ii. The first Pride Month occurred as "Gay & Lesbian Pride Month" in 1999 and 2000 under President Clinton. From 2009 to 2016, President Obama declared June "LGBT Pride Month" through presidential proclamations.
 - iii. Pride Month has been recognized by President Trump in 2019 and President Biden in 2021 and 2022.
 - iv. Pride Month is not formally recognized by any piece of legislation from the U.S. Congress.
 - c. Jimmy Carter Fact of the Week:
 - i. Jimmy Carter was the first U.S. President to support a gay rights plank on a major party platform for the presidency in 1980.
 - ii. Jimmy Carter was also the first U.S. President to have his staff meet with LGBTQ+ activists at the White House. He also opposed the infamous Proposition 6 in California that would have outlawed LGBTQ+ Americans from teaching in schools during his presidency.
 - d. June 12th is also the 6-year anniversary of the Pulse Nightclub Shooting.
 - i. 49 innocent lives were taken on June 12, 2016 by a gunman in Orlando who targeted the LGBTQ+ Community.
 - ii. UCF Social Justice & Advocacy will be holding the 'UCF Remembers' event outside of Millican Hall on June 6, 2022 at 7:30pm.
 - iii. The Six-Year Pulse Remembrance Ceremony will be held from 7pm to 8pm on June 12, 2022 at the Pulse Interim Memorial.
 - 1. The observance is open to the general public via livestream from the onePulse Foundation <u>Facebook Page</u>. In-person is private to the families of the victims.
 - e. UCF Vigil for Uvalde Victims
 - i. June 7th at 7pm at the Pulse Memorial outside the Student Union.

 - Good afternoon everyone! As you all are probably aware, I incorporated addendums
 into the expectations for the Legislative Reports, which we will go over in just a
 minute.
 - b. Happy Pride Month! To add onto Chair Hall's explanation of the history behind Pride Month, there had been annual pro-LGBTQ+ demonstrations through the 1950s and 60s, a time that was notoriously opposed to the community. In 1968, the slogan "Gay Is Good," coined by Frank Kameny, began to circulate as a means to counter the social opposition to the community.
 - c. This week also marks two weeks after a 68 year old gunman attacked a Taiwanese congregation on 16 May, 2022 in Southern California, wherein one man, Dr. John Cheng (53), was killed whilst protecting the mostly elderly group. The gunman, who was Chinese-American, is alleged to have conducted the attack out of a politicized hate.
 - d. OTD:
 - i. In 1968, Simon & Garfunkel's "Mrs. Robinson" from the movie "The Graduate" hits #1, becoming the first rock song to win a Grammy for Record of the Year.
 - ii. 2013: Bayern Munich becomes the first treble winning team in the Bundesliga (treble = winning three tournament trophies)
 - iii. (In time for Pride Month): In 1979, 10 years after the Stonewall Riots, LA passes its first homosexual rights bill (technically 2 June but it's significant).

 - This is specifically about the advice of the GAC on if there is anything they would like to see. We ultimately have final say on the Student Priorities Survey but I feel this is a fair olive branch to make sure the GAC feels seen by the GAP Committee.
- ii. SBA Chair Salerno did express interest in collaboration between our two committees on the Student Priorities Survey as the data would be beneficial to both committees throughout the year.
- c. Midterms 2022 Election Schedule Breakdown

- d. Midterms 2022 Primary Election Discussion
 - i. Primary Election: August 23rd
 - ii. Deadline to Register: July 25th (middle of summer)
 - 1. This will be updated over time, as certain dates are TBD (i.e. Seminole County's general election).
 - 2. Reason why we push for Seminole: A lot of students are from Seminole County.
 - 3. Vote By Mail Clarifications are also present on the document.
 - a. REQUEST DEADLINE: When you can request a VBM by.
 - b. VBM Submission: There is not a set date you need to send a VBM in. (Mail travels differently).
 - c. Recommendation is that a voter should send it in a week prior. Any time sooner it may not count.
 - d. If you get a VBM, you can bring it into an in-person polling station and turn it in.
 - iii. What are some potential and practical ideas to register students to vote during the Summer semester?
 - Voter Registration during Orientation. Orange County SoE hasn't returned contact. Might need to go in person to work face-to-face. Could be tabling indoors, but also might not. Volunteer sheet will do out.
 - a. Much more limited since Deadline is in dead of summer.

- Caldwell: Since this is time sensitive, we could print off a link sent
 - (<u>https://registertovoteflorida.gov/eligibilityreactive</u>) and put them up as flyers.
 - 1. Hall: Will need permission to print and hang, but very good idea.
- ii. Damarla: PIRG was working on a module for voter registration.
 - Hall: Lots of people, student and parent alike, don't necessarily understand voter registration, but it could be beneficial to have an internal module (workshop?) to train students on the Do's/Don'ts.
 - Galloway: 53rd Session GAP, Fmr. PT Slaughter tried to work w/ FYE contact to get this running. Possible roadblock but we can definitely get an update on that.
 - 3. We also did Chapter Visits w/ Greek, so this is something we can do. We can do it in-person or virtually.
- iii. Almenar: Somebody mentioned a QR code, there is an issue with registering out of state students, which would prevent them from being recognized online. They would have to go over paper.

 - Hall: The difficulty is they may not meet in person. RSOs are tabling in person, but there are members that would be online. Voter education is something we could get Judicial onboard.
