Priorities Subcommittee	Voter's Subcommittee

- i. Today I wanted to gauge the committee as to what subcommittee you would want to sit on. For reference:
 - 1. **Priorities Subcommittee:** Tasked primarily with developing initial research, reports on Legislative Priorities for DATC. To be led by Chair Temple.
 - a. Responsibilities:
 - i. Working on researching preliminary statistics, articles and other information relating to student priorities
 - ii. Drafting priority briefs to consolidate research, information for long-term use
 - 2. Voter's Subcommittee: Tasked with developing the information for the Voter's Guide for the upcoming midterm elections. To be led by Vice Chair Almenar.
 - a. Responsibilities:
 - i. Researching the candidates, policy platforms and ballot measures for Florida
 - ii. Developing a physical and/or for presenting this information
- ii. The LJR, Pro-Temp Rep and GAC will be allocated based on need, but for the most part the subcommittees will have roughly half of the full committee therein.



- iii. When working in subcommittees, the wider committee will go into informal, but the respective "chair" will take note of the activity and record the final informal vote that affirms the day's work. Once the committee has reconvened, the committee as a whole will hear reports from the subcommittees and vote to affirm the actions taken by both committees before moving on.

 - 1. Discussion:
 - 2. Holmes: how can we improve from last years DATC where alot of our legislative priorities where already dead.
 - 3. Temple: the date is already set in stone, was decided before any of us go to our positions.

- 2. What specifics should we include under these?
 - a. Kostis: We need to show where and how campaigns receive funding. IE exon or BP and where their priorities lie.
 - b. Almenar: the average voter will just vote down party lines.
 - c. Caldwell: looking at what they have done in the past. Echo sentiments of looking into campaign funds. Be simple in this aspect.
 - d. Temple: was given idea by DLEG McClellan for a pamphlet with a QR code.
 - e. Foster: platform and policy will be important for students.
 - f. Damarla: How much they lean toward issues, making a graph or bar. Making it as digestible as possible.
 - g. Castelin: Agrees with the QR code idea, we should not put the nitty gritty details in the pamphlet, most students won't read the entire thing. Could ad pictures of candidates.
 - h. Dleg: Expanding on pamphlet idea, when you have pamphlet most people will throw them away. Have important info on the pamphlet to get students to engage with the QR code. Not to waste paper.
 - i. Cura: just having QR codes everywhere to save on paper.
 - j. Temple: giving basic information then QR code will have a lot more information.
 - k. Domino: if there is a way to put information on the closest 3 voting stations, and at Voter registration events. And to put how to register to vote on the pamphlet.
