 - i. Lipner: My biggest concern is if the survey has any discrepancies. Students concerned about public welfare, civil liberties, etc becoming intertwined.
 - ii. Varela: I am open to renaming them if you have examples to make them more clear.
 - iii. Gaudio: My question is in regards to the survey. Do you have any ideas in addition to the survey to drive engagement other than tabling to gauge more people. Perhaps a whiteboard.
 - iv. Varela: I would want a whiteboard of what issues are more important to you. Do not want make people uninclined to fill out the survey though. Get engagement by talking to students in open forum and allow them to express concerns and learn about GAP. Plan to meet with political RSOs to gain their perspective for DATC.
 - v. Faucette: Is there a different thing to call it besides subject areas? My head goes to math, science, etc. Is there something else we can call it?
 - vi. Varela: Policy Area sounds better.
 - vii. Reed: Is there a way we can go to classes and speak in person about DATC and contact department heads to send it out?
 - viii. Varela: Definitely will be contacting department heads to send it out. If anyone else in committee has that web course, reach out.
