## ELECTIONS & APPOINTMENTS COMMITTEE

### 01. How to Apply

**Q:** How can I apply for open positions in UCF Student Government?

**A:** Students interested in applying should monitor Student Government announcements for current vacancies, submit the required application materials via KnightConnect, and prepare to be interviewed by the committee. Following the interview, E&A submits a recommendation to the Senate, which votes on the appointment. Students who have questions about the application process may contact the committee directly at [sga\\_ea@ucf.edu](mailto:sga_ea@ucf.edu).

### 02. Confirmation Hearing

**Q:** How should someone prepare to be seen in E&A for an open position?

**A:** Being seen in E&A is largely a vetting process before an appointee is seen on the Senate floor. Be familiar with the duties and responsibilities of your appointed role and what initiatives/changes you would like to enact if confirmed.



### 03. E&A Committee

**Q:** How is the committee different from the Election Commission?

**A:** E&A is a Senate committee that establishes and maintains the rules governing elections and vets candidates for appointment. The Election Commission is a separate body that administers the elections themselves, including marketing, polling, and enforcement of the Election Statutes during the election period. E&A provides legislative oversight of the Commission.

### 05. E&A Meetings

**Q:** Are meetings open to students?
