

Student Body Advocacy Committee FAQs

How does SBA advocate for students?

SBA meets with leading university officials, registered student organizations, and Student Government Agents to promote student voices and concerns, conducts surveys to better understand and champion student issues, and passes resolutions and proclamations advancing student-led advocacy efforts.

Can I attend an SBA meeting?

Our meeting times are posted on the SG website and open to the public. Students can speak during Open Forum at the start of committee meetings and voice their opinion on any committee business, bills, or other matters the committee is overseeing. A Senator can motion for a non-committee member to speak anytime outside of Open Forum!

How can I get in contact with SBA?

What does the SBA do once they have my concern?

When SBA receives your concern, it will promptly be reviewed by the committee. The committee will take the steps necessary to aid your concern, either by connecting you with the appropriate officials, departments, or reaching out on your behalf. SBA is dedicated to making students' voices heard. Understanding and acting on student concerns is a priority for the committee!

What does a Proclamation do for students?

A Proclamation is a formal, ceremonial declaration made by the Student Government Senate Body to recognize important issues, events, or observances. A Proclamation is signed by the Senate President and the Student Body President once it is passed on a first and second reading.

What does a Resolution do for students?

A Resolution is a formal statement outlining an opinion or intent of the Student Government Senate Body. Resolutions are passed to encourage the University of Central Florida to act on the issue explained in the Resolution. A Resolution is signed by the Senate President and the Senate President Pro Tempore once it is passed on a first, and second and/or third reading.
